

Supplementary Figure 1. Difference in parents' enjoyment of housework and childcare activities by partner presence (partnered parents only)



Note: Positive values indicate greater enjoyment of an activity while a partner is present compared to when s/he is not present. Bars indicate 95% confidence intervals.
